Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC)

Additionally, the association fosters the membership's teaching, research and service missions both nationally and internationally. Addressing the interests of producers and consumers of food and fiber, the interests of animal owners, and those of pet owners, AAVMC's principal goal is improving the quality of human and animal life. Specifically, we continue to address societal concerns about food safety, advance veterinary education, improve animal health and well being, strengthen biomedical research and enhance environmental quality.
