The University of Missouri, the first university west of the Mississippi River, is located in Columbia, Missouri. This rapidly growing city of more than 70,000 is situated 125 miles from St. Louis and Kansas City and about 100 miles north of the Missouri Ozarks. It is frequently ranked by Money magazine as one of the 10 best places to live in the USA. (See www.visitcolumbiamo.com for more information)

CURRICULUM: The first two years of the veterinary curriculum are designed to provide the student with a solid foundation in basic medical science. The final two years are divided into 9 six-week rotations of case-based experimental learning in the veterinary diagnostic laboratory and teaching hospital.

ADMISSION PROCESS:

Non-residents may apply to the University of Missouri by:
1) Using a [Direct Application](#) OR
2) By using VMCAS AND a Supplemental Application.

Missouri residents **MUST** apply using a Direct Application. VMCAS applications will not be accepted from Missouri residents. The [Supplemental Application](#) and the [Direct Application](#) can be found on the college web site. (applications found at www.cvm.missouri.edu)

U.S. citizenship or permanent residency is required. Missouri residents are interviewed in February and March. Decisions regarding non-resident interviews are pending.

SIZE OF ENTERING CLASS: 80

DEADLINE DATE: Both Direct and Supplemental Applications must be submitted on-line by **November 1**. Please note that non-resident using VMCAS have an October 1 application deadline.

SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION AND

PROCESSING FEE: Non-residents who choose to use VMCAS must also submit an on-line Supplemental Application and a fee of \$60. Those applicants using a Direct Application must submit a \$120 fee. Application fees are NOT to be sent before submission of applications.

CLASSES BEGIN: late August

TRANSCRIPTS: One official transcript from all schools attended should be sent at time of application. If you are currently enrolled at application time, an additional transcript is due February 1st with Fall grades posted.

ADMISSION DEPOSIT: A non-refundable deposit of \$250 for non-residents is required to hold an accepted position in the class and will be credited toward tuition and fees at matriculation.

TUITION AND FEES: 2007-2008: \$16,312 resident; \$30,684 non-resident (subject to change for 2008-2009).

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must submit scores attained within the last 3 years from the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) General Test OR the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT). Minimum qualifying scores are 640 (total of verbal and quantitative) and 1.5 on the analytical section of the current GRE General Test. Minimum requirements for the Revised GRE General Test will be available after November 2007. A composite score of 15 or above is required for the MCAT. The GRE reporting codes are 6875 (institution code) and 0617 (department code).

Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. Two or more years of full-time undergraduate study are required to apply (at least 60 semester credit hours). Courses taken in the fall and spring semester of the 2006-2007 academic year may be counted as part of the 60 credits.
