Thank you for your letter of March 1, 2021, on behalf of the listed organizations affiliated with the Supporters of Agriculture Research Foundation (SoAR) regarding support of agricultural research, education, extension, and innovation. I apologize for the delayed response.

I appreciate your efforts to support and increase awareness of the importance of agricultural research and support for increased public investment in food and agricultural research and scientific innovation.

I agree that agricultural research is key to our success in combating climate change and helping farmers and ranchers meet their needs. Ninety-seven percent of the land in the United States is in rural areas and most is either privately owned, with adjacencies to Federal programming, or federally owned and managed. This is an opportunity to use the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) expertise in conservation, science, and research, and the passion and commitment of our farmers, ranchers, and private forest owners to put the United States in a leadership position on climate change mitigation. We must put food, agriculture, and forestry at the center of climate smart practices by building new markets, including renewable energy and biobased manufacturing, and creating new streams of income for producers and landowners.
