



**Dr. Joyce Carnevale** is an Associate Clinical Professor at the Iowa State University College of Veterinary Medicine. She has been a diplomate of the American Board of Veterinary Practitioners since 1996. Dr. Carnevale teaches primary care in courses associated with the Surgery, Anesthesia, and Community Outreach program. As Community Outreach coordinator, she works with welfare organizations in Central Iowa to admit pets for preventative care and elective surgical procedures.

She developed special interests in behavior, surgery, urgent and emergent care, feline medicine, and Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine. She teaches hands-on skills and first opinion case based knowledge. She incorporates Spectrum of Care principles and case-based materials into teaching.
