



Dr. Carla Huston obtained her DVM from the Ohio State University in 1994 and spent several years in private mixed animal practice before returning to OSU to complete her PhD in Veterinary Preventive Medicine. Throughout her career she has held a passion for teaching and enhancing animal agriculture sustainability. Carla joined the Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine (MSU CVM) in 2001 and currently teaches veterinary epidemiology, population medicine, and animal disaster management. She was named Director of the new Enhanced Clinical Education program at the MSU CVM in 2021 where she coordinates student clinical experiences with an emphasis on rural veterinary practices and experiential learning. As of July 2023, Carla is a serving member of the AVMA Council on Education representing preventive
